The 44 defects found in this particular application included JavaScript errors, broken links, zoom inconsistencies and image layering issues.

The meet up, co-hosted and sponsored by [TCL](#) and [uTest UK](#), brought together testers from in and around London and even as far away as Scotland.

The event allowed the Zappers Community to network and showcase their software testing capabilities. Applications tested also included 'brain trainer' Luminosity.com

The event also raised money for TCL's chosen charity, the NSPCC, through kind donations from attendees.
